

## Musical Rainstick

### SEARCH TERMS:

### Materials:

- 10217 - Cotton Filters - Pack of 100
- 10307 - Cardboard Rolls - Pack of 110
- 10830 - Barrel Beads - 140g Pack
- 12008 - Soft Yarn Wool - Black - 100g
- 15733 - Scratch Board Tools - Wooden - Pack of 20
- 16140 - CleverPatch Cover Paper - Black - A4 - Pack of 250
- 10364 - CleverPatch Junior PVA Glue - 250ml
- 10708 - Round Paint Brushes - Assorted - Pack of 30
- 10715 - Splash Mat - Blue
- 11775 - Masking Tape - 24mm x 50m
- 15800 - CleverPatch Junior Artist Paint - 500ml - Set of 11 colours



# How to:

## STEP 1

Create an extra long cardboard roll by joining two of the long cardboard rolls together with tape. (Apply glue before tape for a more secure hold.)

## STEP 2

Paint the rainstick with Aboriginal inspired designs. See below for how we painted our rainsticks.

## STEP 3

Fold black paper over the end of your rainstick and secure it in place by wrapping a piece of yarn around the paper. Tie the yarn so it stays tightly wrapped.

## STEP 4

Insert a handful of beads into the open end of your rainstick and repeat step 3.

## STEP 5

For a fire pattern, pour a thin layer of orange, brown and black paint onto a large drop sheet. Do not let the colours mix together but allow them to touch.

## STEP 6

Roll your rainstick over the paint for one rotation. Allow to dry.

### STEP 7

For a more traditional pattern, paint each end of your rainstick black. Allow to dry.

### STEP 8

Paint the middle of your rainstick brown. Allow to dry.

### STEP 9

Use a cotton filter to paint red dots in a circular pattern within the brown section of your rainstick.

### STEP 10

Use white paint to highlight your pattern. Use the small end of a scratch board tool to paint small white dots around your existing pattern. Look to our design above for inspiration.

### STEP 11

Use a cotton filter to paint yellow dots in a line to separate the black and brown sections of your rainstick. Allow to dry.
