Materials:

- 10820 - Eye Masks - White - Pack of 80
- 16847 - Christmas Craft Paper - Traditional - Pack of 40
- 16930 - CleverPatch Glitter Shaker - Silver - 9g
- 10364 - CleverPatch Junior PVA Glue - 250ml
- 10708 - Round Paint Brushes - Assorted - Pack of 30
- 10897 - Student Scissors - Pack of 20
- 15119 - White Elastic - 30 Metres
- 15800 - CleverPatch Junior Artist Paint - 500ml - Set of 11 colours
- 16142 - CleverPatch Cover Paper - White - A4 - Pack of 250

How to:

TIP

Protect your work area, prepare your materials and make sure you have glue and paint brushes on hand.



TIP

To create a skin tone colour mix a small amount of brown paint into your white paint.



STEP 1

Paint your mask with a skin tone colour. Allow to dry.

STEP 2

Using a pencil, draw a Santa hat, pom poms and eye brows onto cardboard. Use your mask as a size guide. Carefully cut them out.

STEP 3

Trace the shape of your Santa hat onto the back of red craft paper. Attach to the cardboard with glue. Allow to dry. The cardboard will help hold your Santa hat up.

STEP 4

Paint your hat trim, pom pom and eye brows with glitter paint and, while still wet, sprinkle with silver glitter to add a touch of sparkle.

STEP 5

Draw two holly leaves onto green craft paper and three berries onto red craft paper to decorate Santa's hat trim. Cut out and attach with glue.

STEP 6

Glue all of the pieces of your mask together. Allow to dry.

STEP 7

Cut a length of elastic long enough to wrap around your head. Tie the elastic to your mask using the pre-cut holes.
