

Cardboard Roll Simpson's Donkey

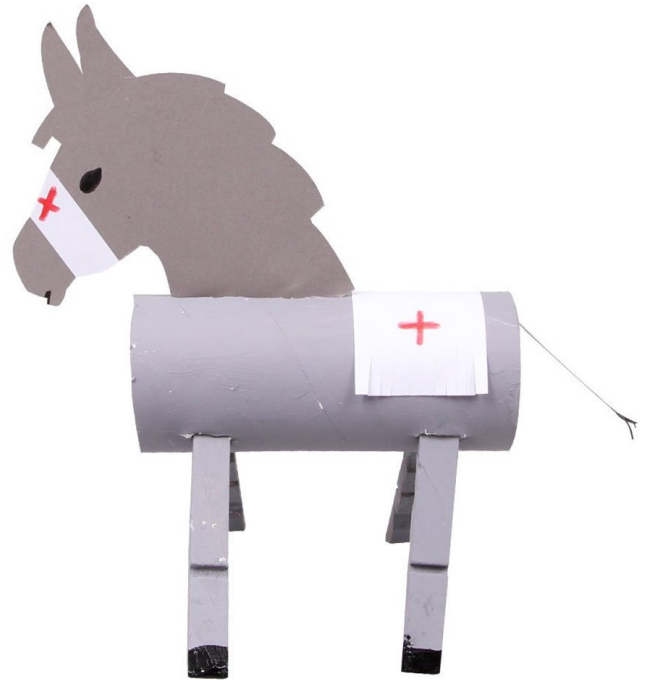
This cardboard roll Simpson's Donkey idea encourages us to remember, honour and assist children to talk about John Simpson Kirkpatrick and his famous Donkey during the First World War. This activity works best with a Stanley Knife. You may need an adult's help.

Search terms: remembrance day, veterans day.

SEARCH TERMS: remembrance day, veterans day

Materials:

- 10186 - Crayola Washable Broad Line Markers Deskpack - Pack of 32
- 10307 - Cardboard Rolls - Pack of 110
- 11192 - Half Peg Segments - Natural - Pack of 200
- 12284 - CleverPatch Glue Sticks - 40g - Pack of 10
- 16142 - CleverPatch Cover Paper - White - A4 - Pack of 250
- 16280 -
- 16885 - CleverPatch Acrylic Paint Tube - Black - 75ml
- 16886 - CleverPatch Acrylic Paint Tube - White - 75ml
- 10708 - Round Paint Brushes - Assorted - Pack of 30

How to:

STEP 1

Download our template and use scissors to cut out your donkey's head from grey card. Cut and fringe a thin strip of card for your donkey's tail. Look to our design for inspiration.



STEP 2

Cut a strip of white paper and attach to your donkey's snout with glue. Use a red marker to draw a cross. Add detail to your donkey's face with a black marker. Colour the end of your donkey's tail black.



STEP 3

Paint a cardboard roll grey. Cut four slots in the bottom of the roll to poke your donkey's peg legs through.



STEP 4

Paint four half peg segments grey. Once dry, insert them into your cardboard roll.



STEP 5

Use a Stanley knife to cut a slot in the top of your cardboard roll to insert your donkey's head.



STEP 6

Carefully insert your donkey's head into the cardboard roll.



STEP 7

Cut a white rectangle of paper approximately 3.5cm x 6.5cm. This will be your donkey's blanket. Use scissors to fringe and a red texta to draw two crosses.



STEP 8

Paint your donkey's hooves black, drape the blanket over the back and attach the tail. Allow to dry.
