

Felt Laurel Crown

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Create a beautiful laurel crown using felt and a headband. The ancient Greeks used the laurel wreath as a symbol of triumph and awarded them to the winners of athletic competitions including the Olympics.

SEARCH TERMS: olympics, Greek, ancient Greece, laurel, headdress, crown, winner, felt

Materials:

- 11185 - Self Cover Head Bands - Pack of 12
- 15173 - Glue Dots - Permanent - Pack of 300
- 17533 - Felt Sheets - Green - Pack of 10
- 10897 - Student Scissors - Pack of 20



How to:

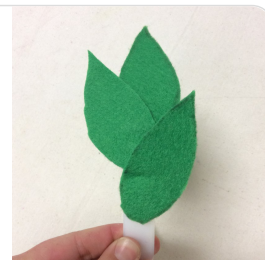
STEP 1

Use the template provided to trace and cut out several green felt leaves. We have used 18 leaves, however you may need more or less depending on how far apart you attach each leaf. Adult supervision is recommended when using scissors.



STEP 2

Starting at one end of your headband, use glue dots to attach your felt leaves in place until you reach the middle of the headband.



STEP 3

Once you've reached the middle of the headband, start to attach the rest of the felt leaves from the other end of the headband. Use the same herringbone pattern until the leaves meet in the middle.



TIP

Alternate the angle of each leaf to create a herringbone pattern.



STEP 4

Your Laurel Leaf crown is now ready to wear! Simply place the headband so it wraps around the back of your head, with the ends sitting near your ears.
